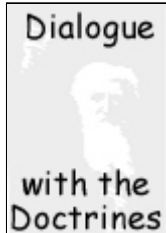

Noted comedian and Sanford native Steve Caouette will provide the entertainment following Mrs. Bush's remarks. The public is invited to attend.

Tickets for the event are \$30, with tables available. Proceeds from the Sanford Salvation Army Civic Dinner & Auction support Salvation Army services, including a food pantry and teen activities. Last year, the Sanford Corps assisted more than 2,000 local residents in meeting day-to-day needs. An additional 90 camp days were provided to local children.

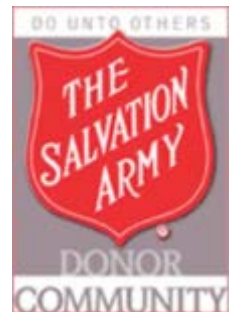

We will not process incomplete or incorrectly completed forms.

1. This form must be completed by a person who attended the event.
2. Ratings of "poor" must be accompanied by a comment in order to be published.
3. The person reporting must sign and date this form.
4. List the booking agency through which you contacted the performer. Please do not abbreviate the agency name.
5. "Audience reaction" refers to how the audience or attendees reacted, not the number of people in attendance.
6. Do not abbreviate your school's name.
7. You must list the date of the performance in order for the report to be published.
8. Please report on only one artist/attraction on each form.
9. Please focus your comments on items that will help other students make programming decisions.

A response from the associate member will be solicited and published for any "poor" rating. Responses must be made in writing, limited to 35 words and received within 30 days of notification. If there is no response within that time, the "poor" report will be published without a response.

Only APRs received from school members will be published. APRs sent by associate members will be returned.
